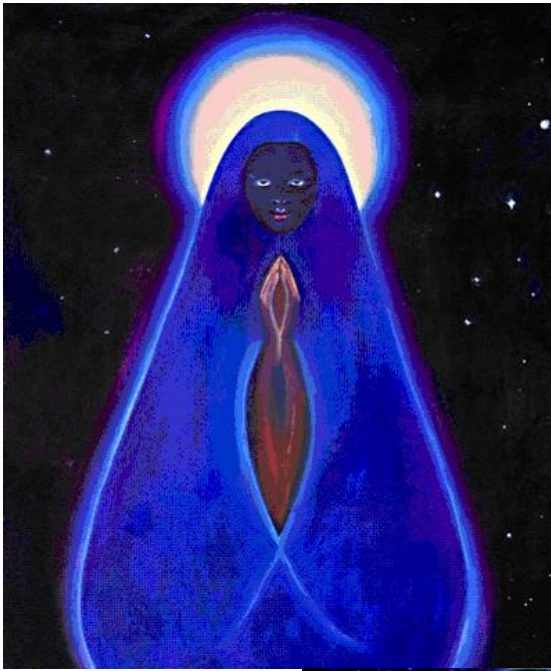

Arrive Friday, April 6th. On-site registration and bunk assignment will begin at 5 p.m. Please plan to arrive no later than 6 P.M. You may arrive as early as you wish on Friday to check out the grounds, hike, meditate, etc. The retreat will end after lunch on Sunday.

WHERE

King's Arrow Ranch, Hillsdale, MS, just east of I-59 North at exit 35, 75 miles north of New Orleans and 30 miles south of Hattiesburg, MS.
